My dear Brother Lacey:

Your postal card of March 25 came some time ago. In the rush of committee meetings attending our fall council my correspondence has been somewhat delayed.

No, Brother Lacey, we have not yet published the study on Ecclesiastes, and I feel rather inclined to believe that it would be better for us not to continue the publication of these outline studies as we have been doing for some time. I feel that it would be better now for us to hold these until you are able sometime in the future to complete the books of the Old Testament, then we shall be pleased to arrange our program to meet the publication of these. We will advertize them to the field, and I am sure they will meet with much higher appreciation than where we run them in only one occasionally. I feel that printing them in this way that the force of them is really lost, whereas if we could print them quite regularly right along, many of our readers would follow the study where now it is only a matter of passing interest or curiosity.

I would prefer not to run any more of these studies this year, because our program is pretty full with definite arrangements which we have made for articles. If, however, you could finish up the books, devoting one whole study to the longer books, and combining two or three of the shorter books into one study, we would be glad to make them a feature of our program for 1926. I believe as you think of this you will see the utility of the plan. I know at least it is much more suited to the editorial program, and I am satisfied it will afford the field much more satisfaction and benefit.
